Welcome to Year 6 Term 3

Curriculum information This is an overview of what your child will be learning this term.

Topic

In topic, we will continue to look at the historical impact of WWII. In particular, we will focus on what happened to evacuees and what life was like in Britain during war time. The topic work will develop the children's research and analytical skills - involving them in using primary and secondary sources. We will investigate why children were evacuated and the impact the war had on day to day life.

Science

A Contraction

Our science topic for Term 4, will be exploring electricity. This will involve practical investigation work where children will explore scientific ideas and use information to help them form predictions and hypotheses.

Computing

This term year 6 will be completing individual projects and then critically evaluating their own and others projects. They will then continue to develop their understanding of internet safety and computational thinking to solve problems.

PE lessons are on Friday. PE will be outdoors this term as we will be doing tag rugby and tennis. Please ensure children have appropriate warm clothing. We appreciate your continued support in ensuring that the children always have their kit in school to enable full participation. Please provide a warm track-suit / jogging bottoms for the cold weather. No earrings to be worn in PE.

PSHE

PSHE will focus on our next two topics 'Mind to be Kind' and 'Resilience'. Children will be discussing scenarios and learning how to deal with different emotions e.g. stress. We will continue to look at scenarios that test our emotions and strategies to deal with these.

As you are aware, Year 6 is a very important year for your child, both in terms of the forthcoming SATs (11th-14th May) and in preparation for the transition to secondary school. In maths this term, we will be completing our exploration of angles and finding missing angles. We will continue to focus on inference skills in reading comprehension as well as developing confidence using strategies to retrieve 🕮 information and develop personal responses to tests. We will be developing their skills as writers so that their writing is highly accurate and has an impact on their reader.

English homework will be given out on a Monday and collected in on EE the following Monday; however, this may vary according to the weekly EE focus - as sometimes preparation or consolidation is necessary. There is an expectation that children will read for at least 15 minutes each 🕮 evening.
