Curriculum information

Our topic in Term 3 is
'The Stone Age'



English: Our English learning will focus on a 'conflict and resolution Tale' by Terry Deary. We will also be learning to write a diary entry focusing on the book 'Stone Age Boy'.

Maths: Our topics this term will be multiplication and division, money and statistics.

Science: In Science we will be learning about Rocks.

Topic: We will be learning all about the Stone Age! This will include Skara Brae, Stonehenge, Hillforts and 'How to survive the Stone Age'.

PE: This term we will be learning about Hockey and Gymnastics.

PSHE: We will be learning about how to become more independent by organisation. In R.E. we are looking at *What do different people believe about God?*
