Our topic in Term 2 is Guy Fawkes.





This term, our topic is Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot. We will be learning about the significance of bonfire night and understanding Guy Fawkes' reasons behind his plan.

In art and design and technology we will be making moving picture cards linking to our topic of Guy Fawkes.

In maths this term, we will continue to solve problems involving addition and subtraction. Additionally, we will be learning all about money. We will learn to recognise symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p). As well as this, we will be combining amounts to make a particular value and solve problems in a practical context involving adding and subtracting money.

In English, we will begin by learning all about poems. We will be looking at different patterns within poems to help us to create our own poems with a firework theme. Later in the term we will be learning how to write a descriptive scene setting for bonfire night. Additionally, we will be writing information leaflets about Guy Fawkes. In phonics, we will recap the Phase 5 sounds from the Letters and Sound programme.

In science, we will continue to learn about animals, including humans. In PSHE, we will follow the Zippy Time programme, focussing on communication whilst still discussing friendships.

Reading books

Each week your child is listened to reading their reading books as well as Guided reading and reading in different situations. Reading is a tricky skill to master and your child will benefit

from reading with you at home as much as possible to build confidence and fluency. Please ensure you ask your children

ensure you ask your children questions about what they have read and see if they can predict what might happen next.
