Curriculum information



This term Year 6 will be focusing on preparation for their end of Key Stage 2 SATs. Natural Disasters will continue to be the topic until the end of Term 4.

Topic:

Our topic this term is looking at 'Natural Disasters'. The topic work will help the children develop an understanding and awareness of why natural disasters have happened, and the consequences both for the planet Earth and the Human Race. Research skills will be used to find out about



significant events which have happened in the past and more recently together with the key factors which led to them occurring. We will also be completing STEM activities such as creating a flood barrier. The children will need to think about the best materials that could be used and from here calculate the 'cost' of the materials needed for their design.

Science: Evolution and Inheritance

Children will be learning how to recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. They will learn how to identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

English ĒĒ

This term, English will be based around our topic but with a particular 🕮 focus on preparing for SATs—Reading, Writing and SPAG papers. The focus text will be Quake and will involve writing persuasive, balanced argument and narrative texts.

 $rak{W}$ English homework will be given out on a weekly basis and the children $rak{W}$ Ē will be bringing home new revision books for them to work in. These books need to be in school everyday as they will be used in lessons. EF I Homework day will continue to be Wednesday and collected in the 🛐 following Wednesday, however, this may vary according to the weekly 🛐 focus – as sometimes preparation or consolidation is necessary. EF

There is an expectation that children will read for at least 15 minutes three times a week—this will be checked weekly through the reading 🛐 EF records.

PE lessons are on a Thursday. PE will include two outdoor games sessions—tag rugby and tennis. We appreciate your continued support in ensuring that the children always have their kit in school to enable full participation. PSHE

We will be joined by Mrs Goatham and Mrs Purves during PSHE this term to look at strategies the children can use to deal with different emotions. Particularly, the children will be considering how they can ensure they have a growth mindset and think in a positive way even when faced with difficult challenges.
