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
## Year 5 Newsletter

### Curriculum Information Wizarding Worlds

**English**: We will be exploring J. K. Rowling's Harry Potter stories and films. Children will be developing their own magical creatures, creating film pitches and writing newspaper reports.



**Maths**: The children will be focusing on fractions (ordering,

comparing, adding, subtraction and multiplication) and beginning to look at decimals and percentages. Science: We will be exploring the life cycles and

habitats of animals, including the animal stars

of Harry Potter. **PE**: This term, we will be perfecting our tennis tactics and work in teams playing tag rugby. **Art:** We will be using



different mediums to create magical creatures and spells.

**Topic:** We will be playing the role of location scouts and using our knowledge of different geographical settlements to pick a location for our films.

**Computing:** We' are artists—children will explore how different software programmes can create art on our computers.

**PSHE:** We will be developing strategies to help us maintain healthy relationships but also to cope with difficult situations. SALUS will be delivering these sessions this term. We are expecting a fun and engaging time for our children.

**RE:** We will be thinking about What matters most to Christians and Humanists.

**French:** Quelle est la date aujourd hui? The children will be learning about the days of the week and months of the year, as well as learning to describe the weather.

#### Reading at home

Reading is a tricky skill to master and your **child will benefit from reading with you at home as much as possible in order to build confidence and fluency.** This includes lots of 'book talk' e.g. what the charac-

ters think and how they feel, what will happen next etc. We hope that each child will be able to read at least **3 times each week** and that their reading record is signed by an adult and returned to school.



P.E. is on Monday afternoons this term. Please could you ensure your child has their <u>correct</u> P.E kit in school and that it is appropriate for the weather; we will go outside come rain or shine! <u>Please</u> <u>remove earrings on these</u> <u>days.</u>

#### Homework:

Reading: children should be reading EVERY day.

Sp'ellings: these are set each week and tested in a dictation. Homework projects: 3 to be completed over the term. Details are in children's homework books.

# How can you help at home?

Times tables, reading, spelling games (children are given weekly spellings to practise, playing board games etc.)
