
# Year 5 Newsletter

# Magnificent Mayans

We will be creating non-chronological reports about the Maya people as well as writing our own Maya myths.



This term, we will be preparing for our transition into Year 6 and Mrs Orr will be supporting us in the delivery of maths lessons. We will be reviewing place value, measures and the four main operations.

We will be designing and making several works of art based on and inspired by the Maya culture. Also, we will be completing activities linked to Gaudi as part of our whole school Art Week.

Topic:

We will immersing ourselves in the Magnificent Maya culture. It will be taught through most of the curriculum subjects.

Computing: How did the Maya people communicate? We will be investigating the writing and number system of the Maya and sending our own messages to each other.

PSHE: We will be completing our PSHE unit on sex and relationships this term. If parents have any concerns, please contact your child's class teacher.

RE: We will be investigating the Maya belief system.

Music: The children will listening to traditional Maya music as well as learning to play the ocarinas.

French: The children will be continuing to learn how to communicate in French.
