## Curriculum Information:

**English:** We will be travelling back through the mists of time to Ancient Greece, where we will be reading, performing and writing Greek myths. We will also be researching the life and times of the Ancient Greeks and creating our own information texts for others to read and enjoy.



**Maths:** The children will be revising their knowledge of shape and space, time and fractions.

**Science:** How do objects move? What affects the speed at which something can move? We will be investigating these questions and many more during this term's topic on forces.

**PE:** This term, we will be honing our netball skills as well as creating our own line dance moves, to music in the hall.

**Art:** We will be studying the significance of pottery in Ancient Greece and creating our own pots using clay and other tools.

**Topic:** As previously mentioned, we will become time travellers- exploring the Ancient Greeks and investigating ways in which their lifestyle still influences ours today.

## Reading at home

Reading is a tricky skill to master and your child will benefit from **reading with you at home as much as possible in order to build confidence and fluency.** This includes lots of 'book talk' e.g. what the characters think and how they feel, what will happen next etc.

We hope that each child will be able to read **at least 3 times each week** and that their reading record is returned to school signed by an adult.

We will continue to reward those who read on a regular basis at home with house points, small prizes etc.
