Welcome back, we hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and New Year... and that Father Christmas was kind to you all! We can't wait to get started on our new topic 'Antarctic Adventures', so here's what's in store for your child this term:

Curriculum Information:

Literacy: We will be following Earnest Shackleton and his crew: writing stories about journeys and also creating personal recounts and imagining that we were part of the ill-fated expedition that sailed to the Antarctic.



Maths: The children will be revising their knowledge of fractions, percentages and decimals.

Science: We will be investigating the life processes of humans and discovering the changes that occur from birth to old age.

PE: This term, we will be perfecting our hockey skills as well as developing our gymnastic techniques.

Art: We will be researching and imitating the style used by Monet to create our own Antarctic landscapes.

Topic: We will be researching Antarctica itself but also the life and times of other polar explorers right up to the present day; comparing and contrasting their explorations with that of Shackleton.

Computing: What would Shackleton and his crew have written had they had the Internet? We will be imagining just that by writing blogs from the perspective of the explorer and his crew.

PSHE: We will be developing strategies to help us maintain healthy relationships but also to cope with difficult situations. The people from SALUS will be delivering these sessions.

RE: We will be thinking about What matters most to Christians and Humanists.

Music: The children will be warming up their vocal chords to practice singing in rounds.

French: Quelle est la date aujourd'hui? The children will be learning about the days of the week and months of the year, as well as learning to describe the weather.



Reading at home

Reading is a tricky skill to master and your **child will benefit from reading with you at home as much as possible in order to build confidence and fluency.** This includes lots of 'book talk' e.g. what the characters think and how they feel, what will happen next etc.

We hope that each child will be able to read at least **3 times each week** and that their reading record is returned to school signed by an adult.

We will continue to reward those who read on a regular basis at home with house points, small prizes etc.


