Curriculum Information

Reading at home

Reading is a tricky skill to master and your child will benefit from reading with you at home as much as possible in order to build confidence and fluency. This includes lots of 'book talk' e.g. what the characters think and how they feel, what will happen next etc. We hope that each child will be able to read at least 3 times each week and that their reading record is returned to school signed by an adult.
