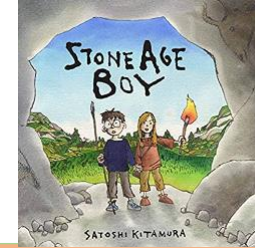




How successful were the people of the Stone Age in Britain?
