Fact 1

London is the capital city (and the most populous city) of both England and the United Kingdom.

Fact 2

London has been a major settlement for around two millennia – it was founded by the Romans and was originally called 'Londinium.'

Fact 3

-London is a very large city, with well over 8 million people living in it (14 million if you include its wider metropolitan area)..

Fact 4

-London lies on both sides of the River Thames in south-east England, around 80km from the North Sea estuary.

Physical Geography	The study of natural things like mountains, rivers, and weather
City	A large town where lots of people live and work.
Population density	How many people live in a certain area; some places are crowded, and some are more empty

Resources	Things we use, like water, food, and materials to make things
River	A long, flowing body of water that moves from land to the sea.
Estuary	The place where a river meets the sea, often with a mix of salty and fresh water
