Key Vocabulary

Physical Geography: Natural features like mountains, rivers, and volcanoes.

Human Geography: Things built by people, like cities, farms, and roads.

Mediterranean: A sea south of Europe; also a climate with hot, dry summers.

Climate: The average weather in a place over a long time.

Population: The total number of people who live in a place.

Economic Activity: How a country makes money (jobs, trade, and tourism).

Landmarks: Famous, easy-to-recognise buildings or natural features.

Region: An area of land with similar characteristics.

Settlements: Places where people live, from tiny villages to huge cities.
