Key words:

Torah- The Jewish holy book.

Rabbi- A Jewish religious leader.

Synagogue- Jewish place of worship and study.

Ark- A special case in the synagogue, where the Torah is kept.

Eternal lamp- A light that is always kept burning above the ark in a synagogue, to symbolise that God is always present.

Bimah- A raised platform in a synagogue from which the Torah is read.

Kippah- A small cloth cap worn to show respect for God.

Shabbat- The Jewish Sabbath or day of rest. Starts at sunset on Friday evening and ends at sunset on Saturday evening.

Shema- The most important prayer in Judaism.

Star of David- A six sided that is an important symbol of Judaism.
