Dear Parents, Carers and Guardians,

Wow! What a busy and exciting term this has been. We have welcomed our new Year R children and they have transitioned beautifully in to school life. It has been lovely to watch their independence grow as they settle in to the routines of the school day. We are also delighted to have pupils and their families join us across the Primary phase and we are now full in every year group. We have also welcomed new staff to the South Avenue family, including our own in-house catering team and I am pleased to say that take up and feedback on the school lunches has been very positive.

After an unprecedented and at times challenging 18 months since the COVID pandemic and the lock downs that followed, it has been wonderful to see the school 'alive' again with our before and after school provision in full swing – after school activity clubs starting up again, with even more, twelve in fact, running at lunchtimes and after school in Term 2. Year 3 took part in a live lesson with the National Farmers Union, when they enjoyed a virtual tour of the country, visiting an arable farm, dairy farm and a cheesemaker! Year 5 reached for the stars with a giant astrodome in the hall and were treated to the sights and sounds of space and Year 6 had an explosive time when they worked together in small groups to make their own erupting volcanoes!

This term, we held Meet the Teacher sessions for parents, which were very well attended and next term, we will be holding Parent Consultations via telephone, at the beginning of November, which will give parents the opportunity to talk to their child's class teacher. It was wonderful to hear each class present their chosen song or poem to the school through the medium of digital technology! 

During our topic the children have had the opportunity to talk about themselves and create self-portraits using lots of different materials. They enjoyed telling their new friends and teachers about their home and family.



This term, Year 4 have been learning all about the Romans. They have learnt how to make their very own shields and helmets. We have also enjoyed learning about the invasion of the Romans in England and how the Romans became more and more powerful. Year 4 were also taught, in art, the method of making their own mosaics. Within the topic of the Romans we have discussed famous figures such as Julius Caesar and Boudicca. Boudicca has been linked to our English lessons and we have written a fact file all about her. The children have really enjoyed this topic and we will continue learning more about the Romans in Term 2





This term, **Year 5** went on a journey through our solar system in the Astrodome.

We learnt all about the different planets that make up our solar system, and even saw some shooting stars!



The children in Year 5 were able to listen and experience the sights and sounds of Space in a large astrodome. They learned all about the constellations, facts and information about the planets in our solar system and amazing Space travel facts as well. This fascinating workshop really brought to life how large and infinite the universe is.







In Year 6, this term, the children have been looking at natural disasters. They created their own volcanoes from a cardboard structure, then paper maché before painting the designs. The children loved completing an exciting experiment of creating lava that flowed out of the tops of the volcanoes.














