

### South Avenue Primary School Term 2 Newsletter





Dear Parents, Carers and Guardians,

Goodness, what another busy term it's been. Year R have been looking at their favourite stories and traditional fairy tales; Year 1 have been learning all about celebrations and Year 2 learnt about Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot.



Year 3 learnt about the inventions of Thomas Edison and Alexander Bell. They learnt that Thomas Edison was the first person to create the first electric lightbulb which stayed lit for 13 and a half hours. The children had a go at creating their own complete circuit to light a lightbulb.

For Year 4 it has been a continuation of their topic on the Romans, with the focus this term on Gladiators. Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed researching traditional Roman pottery and designing and making their own pots from clay.

Year 5 went on a journey to the Antarctic, following Ernest Shackleton and his crew. The children created persuasive letters and imagined they were part of the ill fated expedition. Y6 continued with their topic 'Natural Disasters', exploring the effects they have on the environment and the human race. At the start of Term 2, Year 6 were delighted to welcome Author, Jo Clarke (falconer, writer and presenter of CITV's Wild World. Jo shared her new book, *Spellboda* with the children, which aims to raise awareness of the threats humans pose to the environment. The children looked at blizzards through their English work as well as earthquakes and tsunamis – producing their own Great Wave art work inspired by the Japanese artist, Hokusai.



The whole school commemorated Remembrance Day with a 2 minute silence held under the flag pole as the Last Post played. The school was also decorated with a 'Sea of Poppies' created by the children that spread across the whole school.





This term, the whole school enjoyed a visit from The Sports Project who delivered tag rugby and cheerleading sessions for each year group. The children loved learning the different skills in the activities. Additionally, the coaches provided strategies to support the children's mental health and problem-solving skills.





The latter half of Term 2 has been all things Christmas! It is a truly magical time to be in school and see the excitement and joy on the children's faces as the decorations are made and displayed around the school and rehearsals for the nativities and Carol Concert began in earnest.

The Reception and KS1 children amazed everyone with their outstanding performing skills during their nativity of 'Hey Ewe' and 'Baubles' on Wednesday and Thursday. We are so proud of them all and are certain we have some future actors and actresses in the making!



One of our school Governors, Mr Soyinka, was able to attend the nativities and carol service. He has asked me to pass on his thanks to all the children and staff for all the hard work that went into the preparation. He enjoyed both performances and loved the singing by all. He was very impressed on how well the children walked to and back from the church and said that they were a credit to the school.



Last Friday, we had a fantastic time enjoying the yummy Christmas dinner that the kitchen staff cooked for us - they even dressed up as elves to serve us! We sang along to Christmas music and shared our cracker jokes with one another. It was lovely getting into the Christmas spirit!



This week, on Wednesday, the whole school went to see the Sleeping Beauty panto at the Swallows Leisure Centre ... or no they didn't ... oh yes they did!! It was wonderful to see our younger pupils thoroughly enthralled and really getting into the spirit of audience participation!

In the afternoon, Y5 and Y6 were proud to join with Fulston Manor School for their annual Carol Concert. It was with regret that the decision not to hold a live event was made but I know you will understand that we want to do all we can to keep the community safe. We hope that you will enjoy the carols, readings and fantastic performances virtually.

Yesterday, a very special visitor went around the classes with a gift for each of the children, with thanks to our Friends Association who helped Santa to make this possible.

The children were inspired by the picture book *Journey* by Aaron Becker to write their own text and it was fantastic to see their interpretations and the super writing that was produced across the school – as the year draws to a close we can all reflect on the individual and collective journeys we have been on during the last 2 years, which have come with their own uncertainties.

I would like to end 2021 with my thanks to our incredible staff, who continue to work extremely hard through the challenges that the current times present and provide fabulous learning opportunities and memories for our children. 
















# Peridot, Garnet and Quartz Class Present...




