


South Avenue Primary School Newsletter Term 5


After School Club made a special card for the Queen and wrote individual messages.

It really has been the highlight of the children's week and it has been a delight to see the children confidently explore their environment; asking questions, taking risks and working collaboratively on group projects. The children have made nature bracelets, climbed a tree, searched for minibeasts and worked together to make a bug hotel.

Our topic this term has been Fur, Feathers and Scales. We were very lucky to have a visit from Creepy Claws. Michael, from Creepy Claws, brought along lots of interesting animals including a snake, a bearded dragon, a hedgehog, a guinea pig, a chinchilla, a chick and a tarantula called Rosie. Some of the children were brave enough to hold Rosie and had to be very careful with her as she is very delicate. We learnt lots of interesting facts about the animals and got to feel them too.
