

Curriculum information

Our topic in Term 1 is

'Where do I live?'



In **English**, the children will practise their phonics skills in a daily phonics session. They will develop their sentence writing and their awareness of finger spaces, full stops and capital letters. There will also be a big focus on letter formation.

In **Maths**, we are ensuring that all the skills learnt in Reception are built upon. We will be thinking about counting, ordering and manipulating numbers up to 20 as well as adding and subtracting. In **Science**, we will identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.

The children will continue to engage in Reading sessions—both whole class and individually. We ig will be checking the reading folders every day, 🕮 and changing books every Friday.

- Consider how I treat other people and living things with care and respect.




