Welcome to your child's first term at South Avenue! We hope that you all had a lovely summer holiday and created wonderful family memories together. Over the summer we have been preparing the classroom for your children for our topic- Me and My Community! We cannot wait to get to know your children and embark on their learning journey

Curriculum information

Our topic in Term 1 is

Me and My Community! We will be spending this term getting to know



your children and exploring what their 'super powers' are just like the famous super heroes that we know and love! Your child may be amazing at football or drawing or singing and we want to learn about their skills this term. We want to know want to know what their favourite games, colours and animals

are and how we can support them in their learning by getting to know their personalities.

This term we will be looking at our own similarities and differences between our physical appearances, our languages and our cultures and how diversity can be embraced! Similar to The Hulk and Iron Man, they are so different in many ways but have many special talents and skills.

We will be introducing our classroom rules which all pupils will agree on working to and following to keep our classroom and our selves safe! This term will see us learning the routines of the day and how to explore areas of the classroom safely.

From week 3 we will begin our phonics learning everyday beginning with phase 2 sounds. Where we learning individual sounds and apply these in blending to orally blend and begin to read simple CVC words. Your child will receive a phonically decodable book each week which is detailed below.

In maths we will be doing lots of counting from 0-10 through songs and games, lots of which can be found online. We will be focussing on counting each object one by one and knowing that all objects can be counted from sticks to claps. We will also begin to recognise and be aware of two objects that match and creating patterns in our environment

Reading

Reading is a key skill to access a wonderful range of stories, learning and imagination! We encourage our children to love reading as much as we do and regularly share stories and books in our classroom daily.

We will begin our phonics learning which is giving your child the tools to begin their reading journey. Each week they will be learning individual sounds and practising how to blend them to decode words. If you would like to know how we teach phonics and reading please join us for our parent workshop on 20th September.

Each week your child will receive a book for you to read with them at home. These will be changed weekly on a Friday. They will then have an opportunity to choose a book from our school library to enjoy at home, this book is for them to share with parents, siblings, grandparents etc and is a book to read for pleasure. This book will be changed every **Friday**.

Please ensure that your child brings their book bag everyday as we will be reading with them.



We are a **NUT FREE** school, therefore please ensure that if your child brings packed lunch that it contains no nuts products this includes chocolate spread containing nuts.


Reception Knowledge Organiser 'Me and My Community'



Reading at home Make reading

ALLOW YOUR CHILD TO RETELL THE STORY IN THEIR OWN WORDS. part of your routine. Read every night before bed or in the morning with breakfast.

Make story time more exciting by using different voices for each character.

Use cuddly toys or figures to retell the story.

Prake puppets using slicks to tell or retell the story.

Read their favourite books often. Allow them to finish the rhymes and say parts they know.

Ask questions when reading: What do you notice on this page? Look at and discuss the pictures. How do you think the character is feeling?

Do you remember when you did this? Would you like to do this or go to this place? Have you seen something like this in another book?
