Curriculum Our topic in Term 3 is information Race to the South Pole'

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This term we will be exploring our topic of 'Race to the South Pole'. We will be using the theme of the Arctic, ice and snow across many subjects through various cross-curricular links.

In **English**, we will be continuing to develop our sentence writing skills, including capital letters, finger spaces and full stops through writing diary entries, exploring non-fiction texts, creating our own poems and writing our own stories. We will be using drama to act out what it would be like to be an Arctic explorer and developing our researching skills by exploring a range of animals found in the Arctic regions.

Additionally, the children will practise using and applying their phonic skills in a daily phonics session, then into reading and writing. We will be continuing to push reading through Reading sessions with a weekly focus on a story. This term will be focussing on correct letter formations and practicing our handwriting patterns.

In Maths, we are continuing to work on numbers to 20. This includes number bonds to 20, addition and subtraction 20. We will be exploring ways in which these numbers can be presented, whether that will be concretely or pictorially, by knowing how many tens and ones to use.

In Science, we will be learning about animals through classification, their various structures and which animals are carnivores, herbivores or omnivores by exploring Arctic animals.

Develop awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time. Children will understand what it was like for real people during this time period- how did they cook, wash, heat their homes, travel etc.

Answer questions about old and new objects, can spot them in a picture and can answer questions about them.

What I will learn:


They can identify techniques by looking at a range of artist's work. They can mix colours primary colours together to create secondary colours.
