Our topic in term 3 is Our favourite stories!

This term we will be exploring a number of traditional tales. We will be listening to the story and exploring the fairy tale through our play. From making porridge for Goldilocks to building a trap to catch the Big Bad wolf!

In Literacy, we will continue to develop our Phonic knowledge by learning Level 2 and Level 3 sounds to become more confident in recognising and using them in both reading and writing. We have some wonderful stories to share with the children to stimulate discussion, story telling and opportunities to have a go at writing labels, captions and even sentences for children that are ready!

In Maths this term, we will be securing our knowledge of numbers to five, including zero. We will also be learning to compare numbers to five and growing to numbers to 10 when we are ready.


