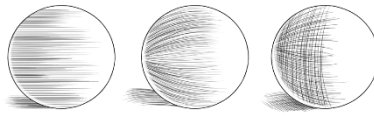
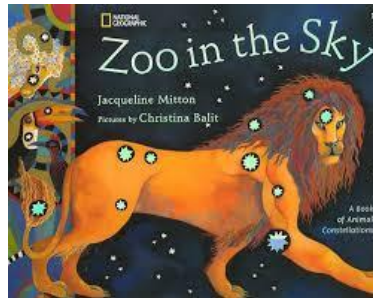




# Art- Zoo in the Sky.

## Key Vocabulary:

- Design- The process of creating a plan or solution for a product, system or experience.
- Evaluate- To assess or judge the quality, value or significance of something typically by comparing it against a set of standards or criteria.
- Layers- Different levels or components stacked upon one another, which can be combined or manipulated separately.
- Sketching- The process of making a rough, quick drawing to capture the basic elements of a subject or concept. This is used to explore ideas before creating a detailed piece.
- Constellations- Groups of stars that form recognisable patterns in the night sky. Historically, these are named after mythological figures, animals or objects.
- Water colour- A painting technique that uses pigments mixed with water to create washes of colour.
